### What will we learn?

### What writing opportunities will we have?

- Labelling pictures

- Spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sound with letter/s.
- Write short sentences with words with known sound-letter correspondences using a capital letter and full stop.

### What PE opportunities will we have?

- Riding scooters and bikes
- Parachute fun
- Climbing and crawling over a range of apparatus
- A range of team games

### What will we learn?

- To practise fundamental movement skills including walking, running, jumping, skipping, hopping, climbing, crawling.
- To use large muscle movements to wave streamers in time to music.
- To develop body strength, co-ordination, balance and agility through different team games.

### What maths and number opportunities will we have?

- Counting songs and games.
- Subitising games using 'fast eyes'.
- Use cubes to explore different ways to make numbers.
- Go on a shape hunt.
- Create shape pictures.

### What will we learn?

- Connect quantities and numbers to finger patterns and explore different ways of representing numbers.
- Hear and join in with the counting sequences and songs.
- Understand that each number is made of one more than the previous number.
- To be an accurate counter (1:1 correspondence).
- Compare sets of objects using language more than/ fewer than.
- Begin to develop the language of 'whole' and 'part'.
