

Value for Life/British Values Long -Term Plan

The Department of Education have reinforced the need ***“to create and enforce a clear and rigorous expectation on all schools to promote the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.”***

As a school community, we do not explicitly promote 'British' values. However, these values naturally embody our approach to the opportunities and experiences on offer throughout our learning community.

Democratic School

- Our children hold a vote at the end of each year to select their class councillor and worship leader
- We involve all our families and children in voting for projects and development areas and so they have a voice for example in the one way agreement and in the review of the organisation of the PSHE curriculum content and vocabulary

Rules of Law

- At the beginning of each academic year, each class reviews our school rules and can share any suggestions with the council. They also vote on class rules so these are personal for their class
- The council and all classes were involved in agreeing playground rules to include the new play equipment the FOWP bought and installed for us.

Individual Liberty

- Our school motto, 'let your light shine, celebrates the individuality of every child and adult in our care. We know that each of our children is unique: each has their individual personality, strengths, interests and learning style.
- Whether it be through choice of learning challenge, of how we record our ideas or present our learning, participation in our numerous extra-curricular clubs, the children are given the freedom to make choices and follow their own lines of enquiry.
- The children write their own reflection in their school reports during the early part of the spring term, during which they are encouraged to reflect on themselves as unique individuals, on their talents and areas they are developing.

Mutual Respect and Tolerance

- We marked Anti-Bullying week each year through a whole school learning experience during which the children debate questions and become more able to understand bullying and how to help anyone is bullied or who bullies others. We took part in odd socks day and all wore odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique and learnt about making a noise about bullying, not keeping quiet about it.
- When we chose our 4 school learning behaviours the children, staff and parents chose teamwork as we all recognised that we need to be able to work and play in a team, we aspire to be collaborative learners by respecting others, listening to their ideas and supporting the learning of other children in school.

- We respect and acknowledge that different children in school and beyond school have different beliefs. Learning experiences about other world religions give the children opportunities to learn about these.
